HANS TRUMM OAM

Hans joined the Club in 1947 and he obtained his Bronze Medallion later that year. He held many Committee positions including Vice Captain, Chief Instructor, Club Captain, Deputy President and was also a Delegate to SLS Manly Warringah Branch as well as SLSA. He was a member of the Judiciary and Building Committees also part of the inaugural Power Boat Committee in 1965 for the "Bartender" vessel.

On the competition scene, Hans was a Beach Sprinter, Surf Swimmer, R&R as well as March Past competitor for the Club.

He encouraged his three sons and a daughter

to be part of the Club and they in turn obtained their Bronze Medallions, became excellent Patrol members for a number of years and competed in Boats and March Past with reasonable success. His daughter-in-law was also a patrolling member.

Hans and his wife Anne, together with their children, were always on hand to assist with Club fund raising activities, events and carnivals which was very much appreciated particularly when the Club had a lot smaller membership.

His OAM was awarded for his efforts in the NSW and Australian Snow Ski Federations as well as his great service to Surf Life Saving.

He was awarded Club Life Membership in 1965 and received his SLSA 50 Year Service Award in 1997 and his 60 Year Service Award in 2007.

Hans' legacy continues on within our Club with his generous contribution towards a Perpetual Trophy, the "Hans Trumm OAM Patrolling Excellence Award", some years ago which is presented each year at our Gala Night for a member's efforts in a major area of the Club that was dear to his heart.

Hans was a great friend and mentor to many of our younger members in his active years and later on in life. He will be missed by many.

GERRY JEFFERY

Gerry joined the Club in 1944 and obtained his Bronze Medallion in 1945. He served as Surf Boat Captain from 1946 to 1952, prior to this he was a boat crew member in both the junior and later senior crews.

He was the sweep in the Senior Boat Crew which won the silver medal at the SLSA Australian Championships in 1948-49 which also included fellow Life Member, the late Bert King OAM.

Gerry was also a very accomplished Long Board (5.5m plywood type) and surf ski paddler, particularly wave skis, in later years. One of his favourite pastimes in retirement and on weekends was to troll a fishing line behind his wave ski whilst paddling out and around the Newport Reef often coming home with enough fish for a good feed for family and friends.

Club Life Membership was awarded to Gerry in 1975 and

he was presented his SLSA 60 Year Service Award in 2006.

Gerry had a very good knowledge of the surf and the varying conditions at Newport Beach. He was always willing to share his experience with younger members, particularly boat sweeps and rowers.

Gerry was a quiet, gentle man, a very good member and will be missed.

2015 was a fabulous year for our Club and it has been a great pleasure to be a part of it. We have such a fantastic group of members and have had so many great accomplishments this season it's been easy to see that this indeed must definitely be the most fantastic season ever.

Our patrolling members have been ever vigilant and spent numerous hours on the beach volunteering their time to keep our beach safe. They have been extremely proactive, completing 827 preventative actions throughout the season, and a total of 156 rescues with, surprisingly, the rescue tube being the piece of rescue equipment of choice for our rescues, closely followed by the IRB. We have also provided 142 first aid interventions capably and with great skill, assisting our beachgoers.

All this is done with no fuss or fanfare, and no expectation of reward of any sort – that is true community spirit.

Newport has hosted an amazing number of carnivals this season including the Newport Junior Carnival, Newport Boat Carnival, The Interstate Championships, 2 rounds of the Surf Ironman Qualifying Series, Wave Warriors, Peninsula Challenge for local Nipper Clubs, as well as our own



Club fundraising events such as the Reef to Reef, Pool to Peak and the Palm to Palms Bike Ride. This is an amazing achievement and shows we truly work together well as one organisation.

A huge thank you must go to all of our organising committees, first aiders, water safety and working parties for making all of these events as successful as they were.

Our competition team has certainly done our Club proud this season with outstanding results in all areas of competition. As a Club we won the Branch Open Championship and the State Open Championship. The Highlight of Newport's

competition season would have to be the result at the Open Australian Championships - our best result ever with the Club coming in at 2nd place, being the highest placed NSW Club for that event. This amazing result at the Aussies lead us to take out the Handicap Pointscore title as well.

The other highlights of the Australian Championships would have to be our own home grown Charlie Brooks and newer member Georgia Miller both winning Male and Female Competitor of the Championships Awards. Congratulations to both of you – it is an amazing honour. Well done.

We have also had another great year in education and training with 44 SRC awards, 64 Bronze Medallion awards, 75 higher awards including IRBC, IRBD, ARTC, Spinal and BBM and 3 Gold Medallions.

These awards are a massive boost to our patrol strength and depth and are what makes this Club the efficient patrollers that we are. Well done and thank you to everyone who has completed a higher award this season and I would like to encourage you to continue completing SLSA awards to strengthen your patrols, your own knowledge and the Club. 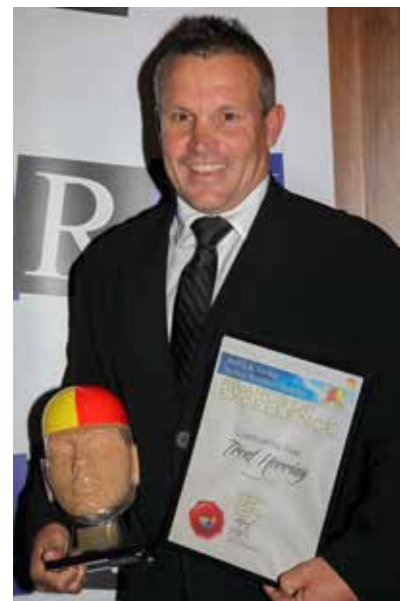

HONORARY TREASURER'S REPORT

ALAN CHANNELLS

Being my first year as Honorary Treasurer of our Club, I have enjoyed a steep learning curve. Indeed the year would have been most difficult without the fantastic support of both Bev Barnes, our hard working Administrator and last year's Treasurer, Ian Storey. Ian's 10+ years experience with the Club's accounts and administration proved to be invaluable particularly with the preparation of the following accounts.

My priority for this year was to introduce internet banking and online account authorisations to the Club's administration. This initiative did take some time to establish and now works very effectively and efficiently. Setting up a Debit Card facility, operating as a 'petty cash' facility has proved to be more difficult, however this facility will be in operation before the end of July.

This year the Club has recorded a small deficit of income over expenditure of -\$1090. The deficit resulting from a 20% write down of the \$50,343 Clothing Store stock at cost value.

Payment of the significantly over budget Change Room renovations in March put the Club in a difficult short term cash position. With assistance from the Academy and Nippers Committee a manageable cash

position was made possible. The second half of the season is traditionally a low income period, which usually results in a tight cash flow. The Committee is to develop a cash flow plan that will sustain the Club through such periods.

Sponsorship and donation income for the year increased 10%. This figure represents a 23% drop in donations, offset by a significant 39% increase in sponsorships. Monica Lerpiniere is to be congratulated on her outstanding success with sponsorship income. We had a 6% drop in total Club membership which was offset by a small increase in subscriptions.

With a reduction in yoga classes, hall hire income was also down 30% on the previous year. However Bar operations provided income of \$62,221, being a 22% improvement on the previous year. A very active Bar Committee chaired by Ray Bratton, and Friday night operations, staffed by Jane Steinert and Bev Barnes, has made a significant financial contribution to the Club. Also, private function hall hire, including Bar sales recorded a 46% increase in sales. Consolidated Bar and private function income generated a turnover of \$82,936 and

provided a healthy \$37,983 profit to the Club.

The Pool to Peak Ocean Swim was another financial success, providing a \$22,330 profit. Our Nipper BBQ recorded an 89% increase in sales, generating a \$6,264 profit.

The Clubs operating deficit of -\$2,090 results from the \$10,068 write down in clothing inventory. Carnival expenses have increased by 52% to \$19,163 with many of our Masters competitors failing to pay our competition levy.

Net assets of the Club decreased from \$462,883 last year to \$461,792 this year. Considering the mix of prudent write downs, improved operational outcomes and cash flow issues, I believe the Club is addressing the changing financial and operating dynamics that our Academy brings with it.

Finally, I have really enjoyed being part of the Club's membership and committee, working together as we adjust to new operational dynamics. Enjoying the amazing success of our Academy competitors, the constant professional development of our Surf Rescue capability all anchored by a first class Nipper programme, has made for such an exciting year.

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements cover Newport Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity. Newport Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an association incorporated in NSW under the Associations Incorporation Act 2009.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards (including Australian Accounting Interpretations) and the Associations Incorporation Act 2009. The association is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Compliance with Australian Accounting Standards ensures that the financial statements and notes also comply with International Financial Reporting Standards as issued by the IASB. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

The financial statements were authorised for issue on by the members of the association.

Accounting Policies

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. The cost of manufactured products includes direct materials, direct labour and an appropriate portion of variable and fixed overheads. Overheads are applied on the basis of normal operating capacity. Costs are assigned on the basis of weighted average costs.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value as indicated less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Property

Freehold land and buildings are shown at their fair value (being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction), based on periodic, but at least triennial, valuations by external independent valuers, less accumulated depreciation for buildings.

Any accumulated depreciation at the date of revaluation is eliminated against the gross carrying amount of the asset and the net amount is restated to the revalued amount of the asset.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses.

In the event the carrying value of plant and equipment is greater than the estimated recoverable amount, the carrying value is written down immediately to the estimated recoverable amount. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present.

The cost of fixed assets constructed within the association includes the cost of materials, direct labour, borrowing costs and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the association and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to the statement of comprehensive income during the financial period in which they are incurred.

Depreciation

The depreciation method and useful life used for items of property, plant and equipment (excluding freehold land) reflects the pattern in which their future economic benefits are expected to be consumed by the association. Depreciation commences from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements. The depreciation method and useful life of assets is reviewed annually to ensure they are still appropriate.

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation surplus relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

Financial Instruments

Initial Recognition and Measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions to the instrument. For financial assets, this is equivalent to the date that the association commits itself to either purchase or sell the asset (i.e. trade date accounting adopted).

Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value plus transactions costs except where the instrument is classified 'at fair value through profit or loss', in which case transaction costs are expensed to profit or loss immediately.

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period the association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the assets is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the association estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

Impairment testing is performed annually for goodwill and intangible assets with indefinite lives.

Accounts Receivable and Other Receivables

Accounts receivable are recognised initially at the transaction price (i.e. cost) and are subsequently measured at cost less provision for impairment. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

At the end of each reporting period, the carrying amount of accounts receivable and other receivables are reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that the amounts are not recoverable. If so, an impairment loss is recognised immediately in statement of comprehensive income.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value. Bank overdrafts also form part of cash equivalents for the purpose of the statement of cash flows and are presented within current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Revenue from the provision of membership subscriptions is recognised on a straight line basis over the financial year.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liabilities at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association that remain unpaid.

Accounts payable are recognised at their transaction price. Accounts payable are obligations on the basis of normal credit terms.

Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of assets that necessarily take a substantial period of time to prepare for their intended use or sale, are added to the cost of those assets, until such time as the assets are substantially ready for their intended use or sale.

All other borrowing costs are recognised in profit or loss in the period in which they are incurred.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

It is with pleasure that I report on another standout and extremely successful season, with our patrolling members doing an extraordinary job in keeping the public on Newport Beach safe.

The season was as busy as others of recent past with member activities leaping to new heights be it patrolling, training, Nippers, our sports calendar or social events and can only promise to become bigger and better. In a Patrol Season that had everything to be proud of, I thank all members for continually supporting our

patrols and keeping our most prized patrolling statistic intact, 'No Lives Lost'.

The Newport fraternity of lifesavers enjoyed a diverse range of activities no matter what age, gender or passion, although we often sadly farewell some into retirement. Equally we have been fortunate to obtain a list of new recruits. We welcome the young new blood who ultimately may steer our Club into the future.

By commencing the season with 15 patrolling teams, we reduced each patrolling member's seasonal commitment from 10 to

9 patrols. All patrol teams generally experienced a balanced season of extreme weather and surf conditions, creating some safe sand banks for our swimming public to enjoy. Again our enemy, the blue bottle, was notably absent for the second year in a row much to the pleasure of our patrol members and visitors to our beach.

Some notable patrol statistics include:

- Total member patrol hours - 12,886 up by 12%
- Total active patrol members - 467 stable

CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

ROB BARKLEY

In a season full of highlights, outstanding performances and personal triumphs I would like to share some notable accomplishments.

We maintained and upgraded our Patrol Operations Manual for Patrol Captains and Vice Captains. The document gives a consistent approach for the general membership with regards to beach operations.

We appointed 2 new Patrol Captains during the course of the season, Alex Brown (Patrol 3) and Rudi Valla (Patrol 6). Both are excellent choices with good management experience and hold SLS highest awards. Special thanks goes to our mentoring Patrol Captains Tom Kellaway and Michael Rosic who have both shown excellence in leadership.

We had a successful nomination for 'Rescue of the Month'; a programme officiated by Branch and State bodies. Bianca Bratton's decisive action almost certainly averted what could have become a fatal situation of a young professional snow boarder and mountain bike rider. The patient ripped his chest open on a flagpole cleat. With the male clearly in distress and going into shock, Bianca immediately assisted by applying text book First Aid, removing his shirt to reveal a

horrific tear from under his arm through to his sternum, exposing his rib cage and heart muscle. The male recovered from his injuries after spending some time in intensive care. Well done Bianca!

Club proficiencies are an enormous challenge each year, ensuring that all patrol members are given an update on their current awards and a physical workout. Thanks to the Menzies family (Sandy, Doug, Jess, Kieran and Brendan), Bernie Howard, Grant Dargue, Guyren Smith and Michael Rosic for their valuable contribution and assistance.

We retired redundant equipment mid season and purchased 4 soft rescue boards, 4 rescue tubes, 6 radios and water proof bags, 1 new IRB motor and upgraded 2 soft bag First Aid kits and 2 soft bag oxy viva kits. It is worth noting that 90% of our capital expense for new equipment was covered by SLS and Government grants. We thank Craig MacDougal our gear steward for keeping our patrol equipment in a safe and organised condition.

We welcomed 68 Bronze candidates and 44 SRC kids into the fold of various patrols. Thanks to Michael Rosic and his team of trainers for producing well

trained candidates who will bolster our patrol numbers for the season 2015-16.

We ergonomically re-designed the patrol equipment shed to provide greater free area, reducing unnecessary awkward or heavy lifting of Rescue Boards, patrol barriers, etc for the smaller and senior patrol members. The new look gives an impression of an open safe space and well organised. A huge thank you to Grant Dargue and Noah Attanasio for doing all the hard work re-setting brackets, board stands and clipping arrangements and thanks to Craig MacDougal for his design input to create an efficient storage space.

Thanks to Alan Channells for coordinating the Christmas Day Patrol and to the 50 odd members who braved the wintery cold day.

The Pub-to-Pub Fun Run event was again well supported by the membership of the Club as well as being a successful revenue raiser. Thanks goes to celebrity Surf Lifesaver Ian Crutch for coordinating the event.

Special thanks to those IRB drivers doing double shifts between patrols namely Ted Bruce, Craig MacDougal, Robert Timar and Nigel Leck.

We congratulate all members that supported our

Pool to Peak Swim to help make it another fantastic success. In near perfect conditions we had over 50 members attend to water safety and the wellbeing of swimmers under the marvellous organising skills of Brett Budd.

Thanks to Guyren and his band of merry men (Kieran, Matt, Ben, Brendan and Stuart) for keeping our IRB equipment in superb condition and for the enormous help they gave on numerous occasions for water safety and training.

Thanks to the ever efficient Leanne Budd for keeping our First Aid room and supplies up to date and thoroughly clean, and for leading the way on the purchase of our new easy to carry and professionally looking soft bag first aid and Oxy-Viva kits.

Patrol 7 represented by Laurence McCoy,

Gordon Layard and Matt Butler took out the Patrol Team Swim Challenge in the Pool to Peak swim. This year we had around 30 patrolling members participating in the swim teams in both the 2K and 800 metre swims.

The Newport community was just recovering from probably its worst storm in 40 years and our last day of patrol was celebrated in wintry conditions, where only the brave showed up to contest 'The Nantucket Shield'. Patrol 5 assembled a confident bunch of hearty souls to reign supreme and take out the sought after event. Congratulations to our Vice Captains Alana Smithies and Jess Menzies for organising some spirited games under difficult conditions and Sharon Smithies for organising the tasty food.

Thanks to all those that participated in our new look and freshly renovated member change room facilities, the works long overdue but appreciated by the all members.

PATROL 4

By April we all need a break and are starting to recount what has happened last season. Which brings me to the Chief Instructors Report for 2014-15.

The training season started with four of our members getting their Bronze Medallion before the first Bronze course was held. Three of our competitors joined a Mona Vale express group (thanks to Ross James the Chief Instructor

at Mona Vale who trained them, I only assessed them, but we'll count them anyway) and the fourth completed their Bronze through Branch.

In terms of training at Newport, the October Bronze course saw another 23 new Bronze Medallion holders join the patrolling ranks at Newport. Amongst the group were 16 candidates under the age of 18. This is another tribute to the strength of the Nipper programme and the ongoing involvement of this group is great to see. We had a father and son team, and the competition between the

pair was an encouragement for all. In the group were two candidates who hadn't come through Nippers and were relatively new to the water. It was great to see them and the entire group grow in confidence, despite the sometimes challenging surf – it seemed like every weekend the beach was closed or the surf was 'challenging'.

The February Bronze group saw another 26 candidates complete their Bronze. There was a mix of ages in this group including a mother and daughter. Unfortunately the daughter is a competitor so

poor Mum was chasing her the entire course. The distance between the pair had shrunk noticeably by the assessment. There were a (large) number of Nipper parents in the group, so water safety should be better manned next season.

We also had 14 members that obtained their PFA (Provide First Aid) and 17

IRB training saw 12 members obtain their IRB Crew certificates and 5 obtain their Silver Medallion IRB Driver award. The IRB's are the workhorses of Surf Lifesaving and provide a great area to further your qualifications.

I would like to thank the trainers (Bronze, IRB and SRC) for their effort and assistance over this past season. Training involves a lot of time but the smiles and looks of excitement repay the effort. To Ben Matthews,

Newport was also well represented at Interbranch and Interstate. James Finn, Olivia Heaton, Charlie Brooks, Jayke Rees, Lachlan Reid, Georgia Miller, Jonah Beard,

Hannah Minogue and Jake Lynch made the Interbranch team. Jayke Rees, Georgia Miller, Hannah Minogue, Lara Moses, Jake Lynch and Kendrick Louis made the Interstate team.

Our Open Men's Taplin spurred on by the success of the U17 Male and U19 Male team's success did the unthinkable and stole the show at Aussies 2015 taking gold and breaking a 20+ year dominance of the Queensland Clubs. Our Open Female Taplin team came close, narrowly missing out on the gold.

Georgia Miller and Charlie Brooks completed our dominance by taking out Female and Male Athletes of the 2015 Championships. Charlie's incredible performance of 7 medals and 47 points would seem unstoppable, but was just pipped by Georgia, claiming 8 medals and 49 points. NEWPORT KINGHORN SURF RACING ACADEMY REPORT

In June 2013, Newport SLSC with the backing of the Kinghorn Foundation and other donors established The Newport Kinghorn Surf Racing Academy, with the intention of making it a centre of excellence for competitive Surf Life Saving in NSW.

Following a decade developing a group of talented juniors, the Club and competitive coaching team recognised the need to ensure that athletes could pursue their aspirations without being forced to relocate to Queensland Clubs, which had been the normal path for competitive surf lifesaving in NSW and other states. They also identified the potential to further develop and build upon the core group of athletes, by developing better

links to the fertile sporting talent pool of Sydney's Northern Beaches, with the aspirational goal of becoming the No 1 competitive Surf Life Saving Club in Australia within 10 years.

Recognising the inability of NSW Clubs to match the revenue base of Queensland Clubs, the Board and coaching team of Newport SLSC sought to establish a structure, programme and funding source that would be independent of the Surf Club, not draining on its resources, whilst preserving the fundamental cultural and service attributes of the Club and the Surf Life Saving movement.

The Academy is underpinned by a 5 year annual 5 matched funding

commitment with the option for a further 5 year term provided mutually agreed milestones are achieved. The intention of the funding commitment is to enable the Academy to achieve the following:

- Ensure athletes can reach the pinnacle of their sport without the need to relocate
- Ensure athletes have the ability to continually improve their lifesaving and community skills and further equip them with broader life and leadership skills
- Ensure the Academy has facilities, management and coaching staff and support networks which are best practice and state of the art
- Invests in skills developments and

techniques for coaching staff and Club members to ensure the Club has access to best practice research, technology and techniques and delivers/ mentors this through members and the Club

- Removes financial burden of competitive surf lifesaving from the Surf Club, but retains core surf lifesaving ethos of volunteering, community service and parent participation
- Provides a pathway for members to retain their involvement in the lifesaving movement for a longer period than would otherwise be possible
- Allows the Academy to be managed as a separate corporate entity, allowing for non-member Directors with corporate skills to become involved
- Develops a clear pathway for the Academy to become self-sustaining and play a bigger role in the community
- Provides pathway for Newport to become the No 1 competitive Surf Life Saving Club in Australia within 10 years

BOARD & SKI CAPTAIN'S REPORT

NICK CARROLL

Well, there's a lot of 'em, isn't there? Boards and skis I mean. In 2014-15 we successfully managed storage of 44 racing skis and over 50 racing boards in and around Club premises, numbers that confuse even me. Again our gratitude goes out to the Council for giving us some grace around the container storage, the Newport Kinghorn Surf Racing Academy's great efforts this year, in both training and racing, would literally not have been possible without this system.

Our basic policy with craft is one of Privatisation — ie make as much space as possible for individually owned craft, and keep the Club's asset level to an absolute minimum. Boards and skis depreciate from the moment you put 'em in salt water, and in past years almost everything in the B&S shed was Club owned - which meant a lot of money just sitting there going downhill. Those assets are now at the aforementioned minimum and held under the Academy's operations, which is great for Club finances. (I've also noticed that the craft seem to remain amazingly undamaged when they're privately owned). However: there's a caveat of sorts here! Newport SLSC's insurance does NOT cover damage to privately owned



boards and skis in storage on Club premises! This means if you have something in the shed or containers, it's entirely your responsibility and the Club can't be held liable in any way for its condition or protection. We'll be signposting this in the shed and containers during the off-season, so nobody's under any confusion on the matter.

Really want to say thanks to the people who helped keep the storage clean from time to time through the season. Also a big thank you to Alan Channells and Jan Proudfoot, masters stars in their own right, who recognised the need for

space as our younger squad members have begun buying skis, and who voluntarily made space for a couple of those supergrommets. This was a super cool move and really helps the kids, who otherwise simply wouldn't be able to train. (They don't have cars to carry skis for a start).

We're expecting some new arrivals in the ski and board dept. also during the off season and the storage will undergo a bit of shuffling to allow this to happen. Spots will all be allocated and you'll be able to refer to your allocated spot/s on our special almost patented laminated guides. Stick to 'em.

SURF BOAT CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The 2014-2015 will go down as one with so much promise that never reached the lofty heights it could have produced. The season was littered with fantastic results including a 1-2 finish at the State Titles in the Life Saver Relay, however the consistency of results was something that eluded us.

We put forward 8 crews made up of an Open Men's crew, 2 Reserve Grade crews, an U23 Men's and Women's crew, a Junior crew and our faithful Masters Men's crew. The U23 Men's and Women's crews performed strongly all season, with our U23 Women making the quarter finals at the Australian Titles as well as finishing 3rd in the Branch final and securing second place in the overall Branch Points Score, behind eventual National Champions Collaroy. With another few seasons in the U23 division, it bodes extremely well for these girls to further develop and become a real force on the water.

Our U23 Men's crew had a stop start season, littered with injuries and delays, however were a constant threat on the water. Whilst failing to grab the elusive major result, the boys were unbelievable in their performances in the Lifesaver Relay, leading the boats in the State final (beating the A crew) and performing brilliantly at the National Titles only to



be cruelled by the seas in the water area and eliminated from the Australian final. These boys should look to regroup and begin next season knowing they were able to match the pace of the top men's crews in the country without having done the maximum amount of training and the competition was still compelling. 2016 is shaping as a defining moment for these boys.

The Open Women's crew were consistent performers in 2015, performing admirably in a very competitive division. Some logistical issues and crew changes very close to the Australian Titles cruelled their chances of a major result there, however the season proved to be a brilliant learning curve to introduce the girls to the high standard being set by the top women's crews in the country.

Our two Reserve crews performed somewhat sporadically over the season, with only one making it to the Australian Titles and they were robbed of their star stroke due to a baby being born! The 'Ressies' worked hard all season

and were always racing at the pointy end of the carnivals, however found the likes of the semi-professional reserve grade crews a touch too fast. With a bit more training under the belt, the Reserves will be a real threat in 2016, so all reserve crews are on notice, 2016 is the year of the sardine.

Our U19 Men's crew were the surprise packet of the season. All were in their first year of rowing and swept by recently returned superstar Jay Borthwick, the boys began slowly before firing into the ASRL final and coming second after leading the boats all the way back into the shore break and losing out on a sprint finish. Unfortunately the boys weren't able to replicate that same result at the National Titles, however they will be far better for this season under their belt and have shown they have the speed to go with the very best, they just need a little refining. Watch for this diamond in the rough to sparkle in 2016.

Our Open Men's crew pushed hard this season and

showed the boat speed to go with the fastest boats in the country on a consistent basis. Strong results at the ASRL Championships and 'Battle of the Boats' had the boys primed for an assault on the NSW and Australian Titles. The State Titles ended in heartbreak being pipped on the line in the semi-final in atrocious conditions. The boys did collect a second straight State gold medal in the Lifesaver Relay, not without being pushed all the way by the U23 Men, including a touching up in the boat race that was saved by an epic sprint off from Open Bowman Lachy Brook, who showed our U23 bowman Jake Reneman a clean pair of heels to race away on the finish line in the sprint finish. The Australian Titles were nothing short of a disaster with the boys being eliminated cheaply after some harsh calls on the line and terrible luck in the surf. This run of bad luck continued into the Lifesaver Relay final, with the boys finishing a clear second out in front with Northcliffe in the boat race, only for the

trailing pack to come from the clouds in the swim leg and pinch what should have been gold for the Newport team and relegate them to 5th.

The result of the Australian Titles was reserved for our mighty Masters, the loveable 'Flounder', who powered their way through a huge swell on the Thursday morning and made it through to their second final in the Masters division. Unfortunately the good luck story ended there as the surf beat the boys into submission in the final, finishing 7th.

Season 2016 is shaping up as one of change at Newport with some brilliant new training programmes in place and some major changes under way. With the size and resources to power forward, Newport boats plans on becoming a

powerhouse in the division and look to relegate the rest of Australia to the backseat.

A huge thank you must go as always to our sweeps Michael King, Rob Emerson, Jay Borthwick, Stuart Torrington and the many fill in sweeps we have. Other thanks must go to our Officials who help us out so often on the beach. Lastly thanks to our brilliant sponsor Sheldon. Peter Law from Sheldon has been a long-time supporter of Newport Surf Boats and we could not be where we are today without his generous support. Thank you Pete for your ongoing support and commitment to our programme.

Thank you to all of the rowers and supporters for making 2015 a fantastic season and enjoy the rest, 2016 is going to be huge!

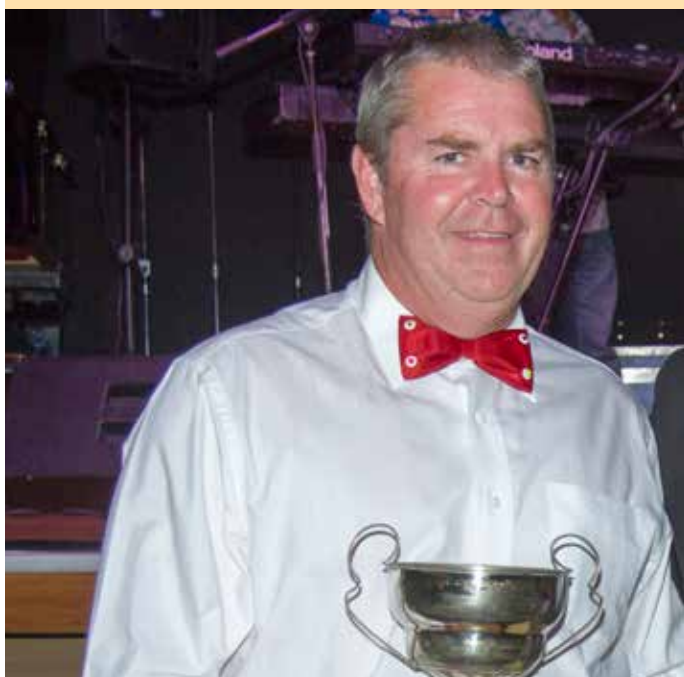
