Brett joined Newport SLSC when his daughter Lauren joined Nippers in 1996. Having completed his Bronze Medallion at Cudgen back in 1976, he felt he needed to brush up on his skills and redid this award so that he could be a confident parent helper. He met some great people, some of whom became long term friends and also started patrolling.

He went on to do further awards, becoming a Patrol Captain and trained others to gain their Bronze Medallion and become Patrol Captains. He moved Patrols a couple of times after helping to build the skills of other members to become self sufficient.

He was also introduced to the sprint team while they were training during one of his patrols. He joined their team and went on to win many individual, relay Branch, State, Aussie and World Titles. His willingness to help at Newport Carnivals and Big Swims caught the eye of the Club Committee and he soon became the Club Captain - a position he held from 2008 - 2012. He then became involved in the Club Judiciary and Building Committee.

In recognition of his contributions he was awarded an Outstanding Service Award in 2012 and Distinguished Service Award in 2016. He was also awarded the 15 Year National Patrol Service Medal. He was awarded Life Membership in 2021.

Brett was a very humble man, liked by everyone which was evident at his Celebration of Life by the attendance of his peers, their children and their grandchildren. His legacy lives on.

CAMERON LYNDON-JAMES

Cam was committed to surf lifesaving and equally driven in business, bringing energy, humour and a touch of mischief to every setting, both on and off the sand.

Cam joined Newport SLSC in 2001 and earned his Bronze Medallion, beginning more than 15 years of service to the club and the wider surf lifesaving community.

A valued member of Patrol 10, he helped give the Patrol, its "gourmet patrol" reputation, creating beachside feasts for his patrol mates with humour and generosity.

Over the years, Cam earned numerous SLS awards and became a jet ski driver, patrolling beaches from Manly to Palm Beach.

He took part in many rescues, including at the blowhole in Warriewood, yet never sought recognition. Quick-witted and resourceful, he could turn hours on patrol into lively conversations about world affairs or bold business ideas.

He provided water safety, trained IRB drivers, and built the kerb for the garden bed in front of the club. He also took immense pride in watching his daughters Sienna and Anaya progress through the Newport nipper program.

Cam's journey from wild child to self-made man was inspiring. He built and sold businesses, developed commercial factories and designer apartments, and in his forties became a pilot, flying jets in America. He lived boldly and inspired others to believe that with courage and persistence, almost anything is possible.

When Cam received his Mantle cell lymphoma diagnosis, he faced it head-on, with positivity and a wicked sense of humour. He was determined to fight, but just as determined to enjoy each day, surrounded by Robyn, family and friends. Cam leaves behind his devoted wife, Robyn, his daughters, Sienna and Anaya, and his stepchildren, Ben and Zoe.

He was one of the club's colourful characters and will be deeply missed by all who knew him.

Glenn was a North Narrabeen Nipper and qualified for his Bronze there in 1974.

On April 9th, 1978 Glenn jumped into heavy seas off Warriewood headland and rescued three men. For this he was awarded the SLSC Meritorious Award in Bronze, the Star of Courage and the Royal Humane Medal for Bravery.

In 2001 Glenn found his way to Newport SLSC and very soon became an invaluable part of our club and surfboat section. Sweeping, coaching, towing boats, repairing boats and trailers - he was happy to help out in any way.

Glenn was also an accredited official and very capable IRB driver, fulfilling that role both on patrol and as water safety at championships.

Glenn received the National Medal in 2010, Newport SLSC Outstanding Service Member award also in 2010 and his SLSC 50 year Long Service medal in 2024.

A good man, Glenn passed away on 22nd February, 2026 after a short battle with cancer, aged 66.

PRESIDENT

Bilgola Probus was warmly invited to our club to learn some basic first aid. The course was well attended and those who took part went home with more confidence and ability to manage situations where first aid is required. Such a valuable skill.



We continued our Fit for Life Program in conjunction with the Police Youth Command, with two separate groups achieving their Surf Rescue Certificate. This program would not be possible, if it was not for a small group of our members supporting the kids each Wednesday. These programs demonstrate the depth and diversity of our Club, which is unique and something we should be proud of. These programs positively impact the lives of so many people in the opportunities we provide.

As we lead into Christmas, we saw the passing of two dear members. I feel that the loss of these members shook everyone. It was time to check in with each other and be kind to ourselves, as we tried to grasp the loss not only for ourselves and their families, but also the wider Newport community.

We were not the only club to have the challenge of coming to terms with grief and loss as at the same time our fellow life savers at Bondi Surf Club were recovering from their ordeal. Again, highlighting the importance of how fragile life is.

The New Year came and before we knew it, we were in the midst of Pool to Peak. Our biggest fundraiser for the club and probably one of our longest standing committees. This small team of passionate members did yet another amazing job of creating our biggest swim since Covid. It is wonderful to see the numbers returning. We were extremely blessed with conditions on the day, and we were one of a few clubs to get their annual swim in before we saw an unprecedented amount of marine activity.

Our Nipper program continues to waterproof our kids with a continuous buzz on the beach Sunday mornings. We saw one of our long-standing Age Managers, Ian Crutch stand down after countless years leading the Dolphins and Marlins program. Although saying our farewells was sad, we welcomed outstanding members that put their hand up to take on the role. Within nippers we are seeing competition numbers starting to climb again which is fantastic, may this continue.

Our Admin, Bar staff and Director of Finance have worked fiercely keeping the bar open and encouraging regular patron visits. By the club providing new seating in the hall, we have given the bar the opportunity to hold more patrons in all weather conditions. This year we saw Bar Manager Matt Barron step down to chase career opportunities abroad. With Matt’s departure we welcomed Analise Kibble and Monty Pate as Bar Managers and they have definitely kept the energy levels high and achieved great revenue results throughout the year, despite the current economic climate.

I have to thank our Education team for not only training new members, but for also rolling out the new lifesaving CPR for all our patrolling members. This was a mammoth task and where other clubs forwent training new members to concentrate solely on getting on top of members skills maintenance, our team managed to do both. Thank you to Jess Menzies who has been in this role for a number of years. We are grateful for all you have contributed to each member as they progress through their own journeys as SLS members.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our Patrol Captains who again ensured our visitors stayed safe. Fulfilling all of our required SOPs and

meeting additional requirements as circumstances changed daily with the influx of marine life. This was definitely a new challenge for all of us that brought about a lot of insecurity for our visitors. Our patrols ensured more IRB activity, vigilance in their scanning methods and adopting the help of drones being deployed off the coast.

Thank you to Jeremy Paul, Director of Finance who keeps us in a good position financially as we endeavor to move towards our build. We had a successful grant application early this year that has allowed us to move forward with our Certificate of Design Compliance. This is a massive step in the right direction.

I would like to thank the Kinghorn Academy Board for providing an environment in which our Athletes can thrive. The program that the Academy provides not only puts us ahead of many clubs but provides the perfect environment for our athletes to succeed but also spill over to have many positive impacts on the club as a whole.

I could not do what I do, without the amazing team I have behind me. To the Executive Board members, thank you to each and every one of you for your time, energy and advice. I believe we approach everything as a team and it has been a privilege working with you. For those that are moving on next season, you will be missed and thank you for being a valuable member of the team.

To Guyren Smith my Deputy, thank you for the endless conversations, advice and guidance. No one could have asked for a better Deputy in my first year in this role. Guyren has driven the chase for grants as we move forward in our build, along with continuing to build relationships with our sponsors.

FINANCE

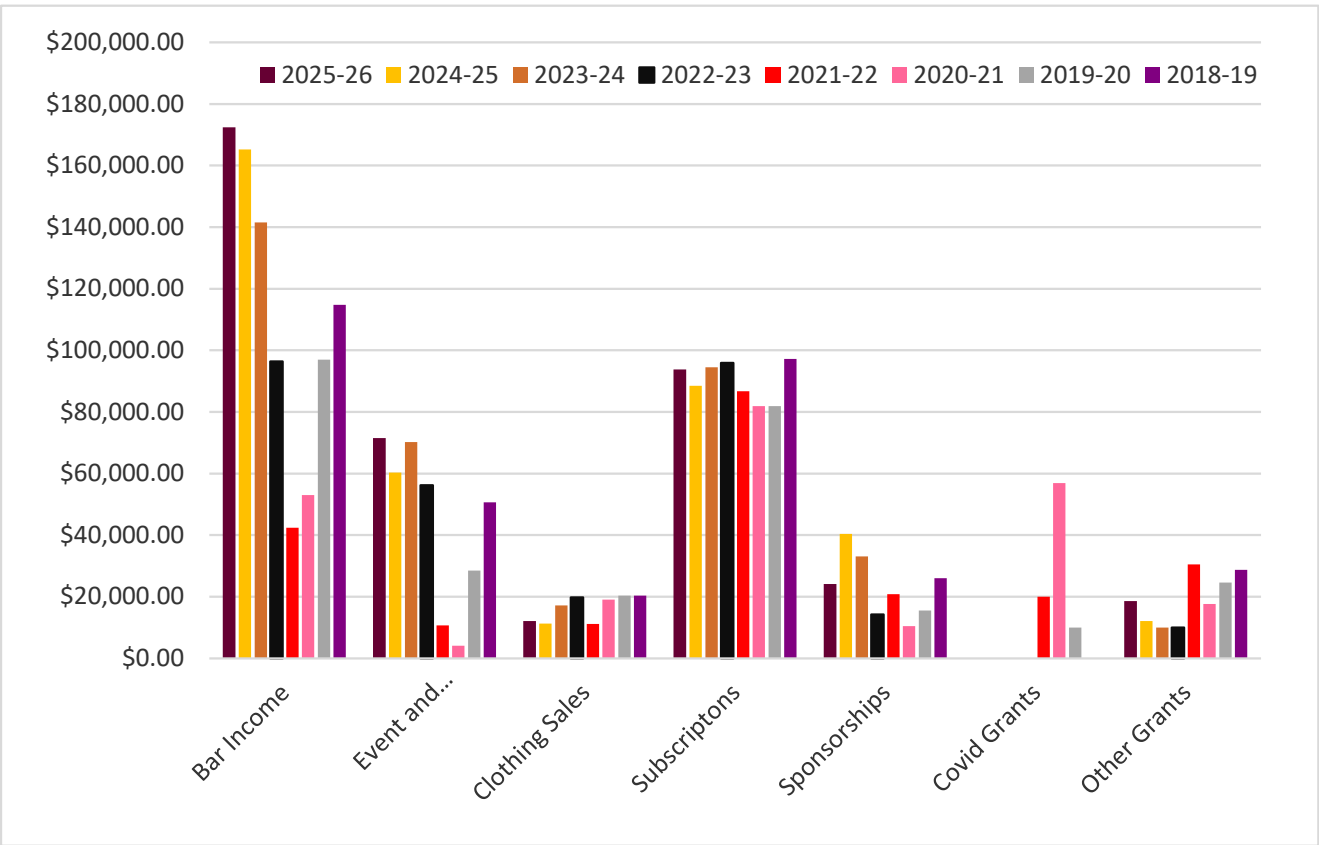
This is my fifth and final report as Director of Finance, with the Club’s constitutional rotation bringing my term in the role to an end. It is therefore especially pleasing to conclude with Newport Surf Life Saving Club in a sound and stable financial position. For the year ended 30 April 2026, the Club achieved its strongest surplus for several years. That outcome was delivered while cost-of-living pressures continued to affect both the Club and our members. Throughout the year, the focus remained on protecting the Club’s resources while continuing to fund the activities, equipment and facilities that support our purpose.

Comprehensive Income for FY25-26 was \$33,598, compared with \$19,749 last year. Total Operating Revenue and Other Income was \$1,075,670 and total expenditure was \$1,042,072. These totals again include the Kinghorn Surf Racing Academy donation and the corresponding expenditure, which offset one another. On an ex-Kinghorn basis, operating revenue was \$500,670, 1.5% below the prior year as several income streams returned to more normal levels after a strong FY25 and sponsorship income softened. At the same time, underlying expenditure reduced by 4.4%.

That discipline more than offset the lower revenue and produced the improved surplus. The result also preserves flexibility as the Club considers the next stages of its approved redevelopment. I thank the Board for its support of this measured approach.

The bar remained one of the Club’s most important income sources. Revenue increased to \$172,402 from \$165,260 under the continued stewardship of our bar team. Reliable opening hours, sensible pricing, inside furniture and favourable weather supported the result, as did the continued patronage of members and the wider Newport community. Higher activity naturally carries additional wages and Cost of Goods Sold, so the value of the bar is best assessed through both its financial contribution and the social role it plays within the Club.

The year’s income was not dependent on the bar alone. Functions and Public Bookings generated \$60,508, the Pool to Peak ocean swim contributed \$30,198, and carnival activities also supported the Club’s position. Sponsorship income reduced from \$40,341 to \$24,091, reflecting the same economic pressures being experienced by many of the local businesses that support us.



FINANCE CONTINUED

Government grants of \$18,550 and community donations of \$32,591 helped fund rescue equipment, Club infrastructure and member engagement. Our sponsors and donors make a meaningful difference, and members are encouraged to support the businesses that support Newport.

The chart above shows how the Club's principal revenue streams have changed over time, including the recent growth in patronage, the movement in sponsorship income and the contribution of government grants.

Total expenditure was \$1,042,072, down from \$1,073,438 in the previous year. Excluding Kinghorn expenditure, the underlying cost base reduced from \$488,438 to \$467,072. This reflects a deliberate decision to defer non-critical capital spending while the Club's redevelopment remains in view. Wages and superannuation increased from \$131,320 to \$140,700 in line with stronger bar and function activity, while repairs and maintenance were contained at \$7,464 by prioritising essential services over discretionary works. Cash balances increased by \$25,460 to \$445,370. Importantly, this restraint did not come at the expense of operational readiness: the Club continued to fund and maintain essential rescue assets, including IRBs and first-aid equipment. I appreciate the Board's support for this conservative but practical balance.

Membership remained central to the way financial decisions were made. Nipper and Cadet numbers continued to fluctuate, and I thank Janet Dunn, our Director of Member Services, for monitoring those trends and responding to members' needs. The Nipper programme remains one of the Club's strongest pathways for welcoming new families and building surf awareness. My thanks also go to Adam Willis, Adam Gaffney, Stewart Dean and the Nipper committee for combining an enjoyable programme with the vital task of waterproofing our kids.

Nicole Fasseau again gave her time to manage the Club's clothing range. Thank you, Nicole, for maintaining an offering that supports both member identity and Club income. A reminder that you can purchase Club gear directly through the online shop on the Club's website.

Pool to Peak continued to be both a signature Newport event and a significant fundraiser. Its success depends on detailed planning, sponsor support and a substantial volunteer effort before and during the event. I thank John Guthrie, the organising committee and every member who assisted. Given the marine conditions we experienced over summer, we were fortunate to stage the swim this year, and we look forward to putting on another safe event and welcoming ocean swimmers back next year.

Renee McGettigan's contribution as Office and Facility Manager also deserves recognition. Her work across Club communications, administration and the coordination of this Annual Report has strengthened the way the Club operates and communicates. Thank you, Renee.

Annual funding from Surf Lifesaving Australia, Surf Lifesaving NSW and Northern Beaches Council remained critical to our operations. Cost pressures nevertheless continued in several areas. General insurance increased by 11% to \$13,701 and further increases are expected. Consistent with both legislative requirements and prudent accounting, the financial statements again include provisions for impairment of older inventory and for annual and long service leave entitlements. Training and development also remained active, with more members progressing through their awards during the season.

As I complete my term, I want to thank the membership, the sub-committees and the Board for the support extended to me over the past five years. It has been a privilege to manage the Club's finances through the recovery from COVID, a sustained period of economic pressure and the long-awaited approval of the Development Application. Newport's financial position is solid and stable, with stronger reserves and a disciplined cost base providing a sound platform for the future. I am grateful to everyone whose work, volunteering and support has contributed to that position.

LOOKING AHEAD: KEY FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The next Board will inherit a strong base, but continued attention will be required in three areas:

1. Cost Pressures: Sydney's cost of living continues to affect supplier pricing, operating expenses and members' discretionary spending. Insurance alone increased by 11% this year, while event and supplier costs remain elevated. Maintaining the expenditure discipline demonstrated this year will be important.
2. Volunteer Capacity: Newport's operating model depends on volunteers. Families are facing increasing demands on their time and finances, so retaining and supporting volunteers is not only a member issue but also a significant operational and financial consideration.
3. Redevelopment Readiness: Approval of the Development Application shifts the focus toward financial and operational preparation for future capital works. This will require careful management of reserves, active pursuit of grants and sensible sequencing of maintenance and construction expenditure. The increase in cash reserves this year is a deliberate contribution to that readiness.

These matters will require ongoing oversight, but the Club is well placed to address them from a position of financial stability.

WHAT THE CLUB'S FINANCES DELIVER

The financial result is not an end in itself. It enables Newport Surf Life Saving Club to provide a safe beach, develop lifesavers and create opportunities for members to participate, learn and contribute.

Careful management of the Club's resources supports:

- Well-maintained facilities and essential lifesaving equipment
- Subsidised training, events and awards
- An inclusive Club environment for members from Nippers through to Masters

Just as importantly, the Club creates connection, purpose and camaraderie through patrols, swimming groups, competition teams, events and committee work. POOL TO PEAK OCEAN SWIMS

As it turned out we were very lucky to be able to hold our Pool to Peak ocean swims in 2026 due to an unusual spate of marine activity. As our swims were on Sunday 5 January, we escaped the intense publicity and we had a very successful day with 654 swimmers taking part. The prevailing conditions were also good.

Other clubs in the Pittwater region were not so lucky. Some postponed their swims but eventually Bilgola, Avalon & the Big Swim cancelled due to the situation. Mona Vale eventually held their swim with a small number of swimmers.

Our 2026 swims were significant as for the first time we had official CanToo participation. John Guthrie decided to contact the organisation in 2025 & there was interest from CanToo. Subsequently Bec Capell & John held a meeting with executives at their North Sydney offices and the relationship between Newport Surf Club & CanToo was established.

Notes of the Financial Statements

Newport Surf Life Saving Club Inc.
For the year ended 30 April 2026

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements cover Newport Surf Life Saving Club as an individual entity. Newport Surf Life Saving Club Inc. ABN 56 603 611 439 is a not-for-profit Association incorporated in New South Wales under the Associations Incorporation Act 2009 (NSW).

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012 (Cth), Associations Incorporation Act 2009 (NSW), the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 (NSW) and the club's constitution. The Board of Management has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the above acts and regulations, the club's constitution and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements

AASB 107 Statements of Cash Flows

AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors

AASB 124 Related Party Disclosures

AASB 1031 Materiality

AASB 1048 Interpretation of Accounting Standards

AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures

No other Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets. The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the Association is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

In the event the carrying value of plant and equipment is greater than the estimated recoverable amount, the carrying value is written down immediately to the estimated recoverable amount. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the association and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to the statement of comprehensive income during the financial period in which they are incurred.

Depreciation

The depreciation method and useful life used for items of property, plant and equipment (excluding freehold land) reflects the pattern in which their future economic benefits are expected to be consumed by the association. Depreciation commences from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements. The depreciation method and useful life of assets is reviewed annually to ensure they are still appropriate.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation surplus relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value. Bank overdrafts are presented within current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

Financial Instruments

Recognition, initial measurement and derecognition

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the Association becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument, and are measured initially at fair value adjusted by transactions costs, except for those carried at fair value through profit or loss, which are measured initially at fair value. Subsequent measurement of financial assets and financial liabilities are described below.

Financial assets are derecognised when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the financial asset expire, or when the financial asset and all substantial risks and rewards are transferred. A financial liability is derecognised when it is extinguished, discharged, cancelled or expires.

Classification and subsequent measurement of financial assets

Except for those trade receivables that do not contain a significant financing component and are measured at the transaction price, all financial assets are initially measured at fair value adjusted for transaction costs (where applicable). For the purpose of subsequent measurement, financial assets other than those designated and effective as hedging instruments are classified into the following categories upon initial recognition:

- amortised cost
- fair value through profit or loss (FVPL)
- equity instruments at fair value through other comprehensive income (FVOCI)

All income and expenses relating to financial assets that are recognised in profit or loss are presented within finance costs, finance income or other financial items, except for impairment of trade receivables which is presented within other expenses.

Classifications are determined by both:

- The entity's business model for managing the financial asset
- The contractual cash flow characteristics of the financial assets

All income and expenses relating to financial assets that are recognised in profit or loss are presented within finance costs, finance income or other financial items, except for impairment of trade receivables, which is presented within other expenses.

Subsequent measurement of financial assets

Financial assets at amortised cost

Financial assets are measured at amortised cost if the assets meet the following conditions (and are not designated as FVPL):

- they are held within a business model whose objective is to hold the financial assets and collect its contractual cash flows
- the contractual terms of the financial assets give rise to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding

After initial recognition, these are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Discounting is omitted where the effect of discounting is immaterial. The Association's cash and cash equivalents, trade and most other receivables fall into this category of financial instruments as well as long-term deposit that were previously classified as held-to-maturity under AASB 139.

Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss (FVPL)

Financial assets that are held within a different business model other than 'hold to collect' or 'hold to collect and sell' are categorised at fair value through profit and loss. Further, irrespective of business model financial assets whose contractual cash flows are not solely payments of principal and interest are accounted for at FVPL. All derivative financial instruments fall into this category, except for those designated and effective as hedging instruments, for which the hedge accounting requirements apply (see below).

Equity instruments at fair value through other comprehensive income (Equity FVOCI)

Investments in equity instruments that are not held for trading are eligible for an irrevocable election at inception to be measured at FVOCI. Under Equity FVOCI, subsequent movements in fair value are recognised in other comprehensive income

and are never reclassified to profit or loss. Dividends from these investments continue to be recorded as other income within the profit or loss unless the dividend clearly represents return of capital.

Impairment of Financial assets

AASB 9’s impairment requirements use more forward looking information to recognize expected credit losses - the ‘expected credit losses (ECL) model’. Instruments within the scope of the new requirements included loans and other debt-type financial assets measured at amortised cost and FVOCI, trade receivables and loan commitments and some financial guarantee contracts (for the issuer) that are not measured at fair value through profit or loss. The Association considers a broader range of information when assessing credit risk and measuring expected credit losses, including past events, current conditions, reasonable and supportable forecasts that affect the expected collectability of the future cash flows of the instrument.

In applying this forward-looking approach, a distinction is made between:

- financial instruments that have not deteriorated significantly in credit quality since initial recognition or that have low credit risk (‘Stage 1’) and
- financial instruments that have deteriorated significantly in credit quality since initial recognition and whose credit risk is not low (‘Stage 2’).

‘Stage 3’ would cover financial assets that have objective evidence of impairment at the reporting date.

‘12-month expected credit losses’ are recognised for the first category while ‘lifetime expected credit losses’ are recognised for the second category.

Measurement of the expected credit losses is determined by a probability-weighted estimate of credit losses over the expected life of the financial instrument.

Trade and other receivables

The Association makes use of a simplified approach in accounting for trade and other receivables and records the loss allowance at the amount equal to the expected lifetime credit losses. In using this practical expedient, the Association uses its historical experience, external indicators and forward-looking information to calculate the expected credit losses using a provision matrix.

Classification and measurement of financial liabilities

As the accounting for financial liabilities remains largely unchanged from AASB 139, the Association’s financial liabilities were not impacted by the adoption of AASB 9. However, for completeness, the accounting policy is disclosed below.

The Association’s financial liabilities include borrowings and trade and other payables.

Financial liabilities are initially measured at fair value, and, where applicable, adjusted for transaction costs unless the Association designated a financial liability at fair value through profit or loss.

Subsequently, financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method except for derivatives and financial liabilities designated at FVPL, which are carried subsequently at fair value with gains or losses recognised in profit or loss (other than derivative financial instruments that are designated and effective as hedging instruments).

All interest-related charges and, if applicable, changes in an instrument’s fair value that are reported in profit or loss are included within finance costs or finance income.

Leases

For any new contracts entered into on or after 1 January 2020, the Association considers whether a contract is, or contains a lease. A lease is defined as ‘a contract, or part of a contract, that conveys the right to use an asset (the underlying asset) for a period of time in exchange for consideration’.

To apply this definition the Association assesses whether the contract meets three key evaluations which are whether:

- the contract contains an identified asset, which is either explicitly identified in the contract or implicitly specified by being identified at the time the asset is made available to the Association
- the Association has the right to obtain substantially all of the economic benefits from use of the identified asset throughout the period of use, considering its rights within the defined scope of the contract
- the Association has the right to direct the use of the identified asset throughout the period of use. The Association assess whether it has the right to direct ‘how and for what purpose’ the asset is used throughout the period of use.

Measurement and recognition of leases as a lessee

At lease commencement date, the Association recognises a right-of-use asset and a lease liability on the balance sheet. The right-of-use asset is measured at cost, which is made up of the initial measurement of the lease liability, any initial direct costs

incurred by the Association, an estimate of any costs to dismantle and remove the asset at the end of the lease, and any lease payments made in advance of the lease commencement date (net of any incentives received).

The Association depreciates the right-of-use assets on a straight-line basis from the lease commencement date to the earlier of the end of the useful life of the right-of-use asset or the end of the lease term. The Association also assesses the right-of-use asset for impairment when such indicators exist.

At the commencement date, the Association measures the lease liability at the present value of the lease payments unpaid at that date, discounted using the interest rate implicit in the lease if that rate is readily available or the Association’s incremental borrowing rate.

Lease payments included in the measurement of the lease liability are made up of fixed payments (including in substance fixed), variable payments based on an index or rate, amounts expected to be payable under a residual value guarantee and payments arising from options reasonably certain to be exercised.

Subsequent to initial measurement, the liability will be reduced for payments made and increased for interest. It is remeasured to reflect any reassessment or modification, or if there are changes in in-substance fixed payments.

When the lease liability is remeasured, the corresponding adjustment is reflected in the right-of-use asset, or profit and loss if the right-of-use asset is already reduced to zero.

The Association has elected to account for short-term leases and leases of low-value assets using the practical expedients. Instead of recognising a right-of-use asset and lease liability, the payments in relation to these are recognised as an expense in profit or loss on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

On the statement of financial position, right-of-use assets have been included in property, plant and equipment and lease liabilities have been included in finance liabilities.

At the date of this report the Association as lessee had entered into a lease on significantly below-market terms with Northern Beaches Council.

The nature and terms of this lease are:

- The lease payments are \$556 per annum payable in arrears on demand
- The lease term is for 20 years from 1 January 2023 to 31 December 2042
- The asset the subject of the lease is the building at 394 Barrenjoey Road, Newport NSW less certain sections of that building let to other tenants
- The lease provides that the Association shall be entitled to use the leased premises only as a surf life saving club and other uses incidental including permitted rooms hire and functions.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. No value is ascribed to goods for resale that have been donated to the Association where fair value cannot be reliably determined. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less any applicable selling expenses.

Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Significant management judgement in applying accounting policies

When preparing the financial statements, management undertakes a number of judgements, estimates and assumptions about the recognition and measurement of assets, liabilities, income and expenses.

Estimation uncertainty
Information about estimates and assumptions that have the most significant effect on recognition and measurement of assets, liabilities, income and expenses is provided below. Actual results may be substantially different.

Impairment
In assessing impairment, management estimates the recoverable amount of each asset or cash-generating units, based on expected future cash flows and uses an interest rate to discount them. Estimation uncertainty relates to assumptions about future operating results and the determination of a suitable discount rate.

Useful lives of depreciable assets
Management reviews its estimate of the useful lives of depreciable assets at each reporting date, based on the expected utility of the assets. Uncertainties in these estimates relate to technical obsolescence that may change the utility of certain software and IT equipment.

Inventories
Management estimates the net realisable values of inventories, taking into account the most reliable evidence available at each reporting date. The future realisation of these inventories may be affected by future technology or other market-driven changes that may reduce future selling prices.

Long service leave
The liability for long service leave is recognised and measured at the present value of the estimated cash flows to be made in respect of all employees at the reporting date. In determining the present value of the liability, estimates of attrition rates and pay increases through promotion and inflation have been taken into account.

Related Party Transactions

The Association’s related parties include its key management personnel and related entities as described below. Unless otherwise stated, none of the transactions incorporate special terms and conditions and no guarantees were given or received. Outstanding balances are usually settled in cash.

This season marked my second and final year as Director of Lifesaving. It has been a rewarding experience and I am grateful for the ongoing support of the Board of Management, our Patrol Captains, and every patrolling member who contributes to the strength and success of this club.

This year was personally a little different for me. A significant elbow injury limited my ability to be as physically involved as I would have liked. I found this both challenging and, at times, frustrating, particularly in a role so closely connected to hands-on participation and leading from the front on the beach. That said, it also reinforced the importance of the team around us and the depth of capability we have across the club.

As always, the patrolling lifesavers remain the fabric of our surf club. Everyone who pulls on the yellow shirt and red shorts each summer plays a vital role in making this club one of the best in the country.

Firstly, I would like to thank all 975 members across every part of the club — from patrolling members through to Nippers, competitors, Long Service, Life and even social members. Your ongoing commitment, whether through patrol hours, training, competition, Nippers, or contributing to the social life of the club, is what allows us to operate at such a high level.

The season began, as always, with the August Gear Inspection — a significant undertaking requiring a coordinated team effort to ensure all lifesaving

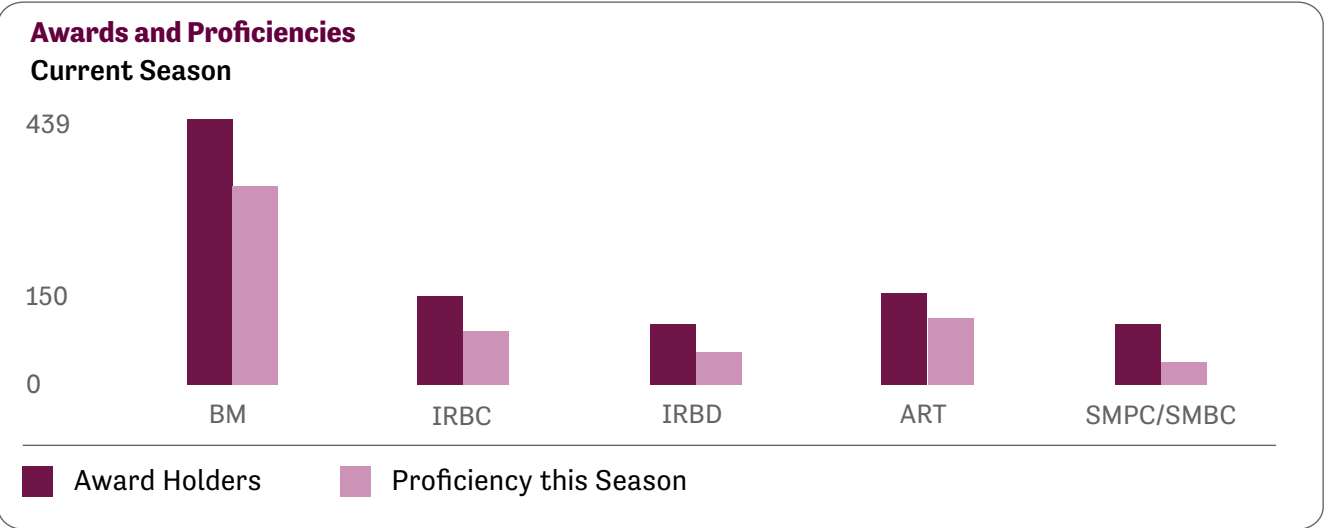
equipment was ready for the season ahead. My thanks to Brendan Capell and the broader team for their work in leading this essential task.

It was also fantastic to see the strong turnout and engagement at the Back to Beach and End of Year Patrolling functions and I also hear the Awards of Excellence Presentation night this year at the Club was memorable and was good to be at home again for this event. These events continue to be a highlight, providing an opportunity for members and their families to come together, reconnect, and recognise the effort that goes into patrolling each season.

At our core, the club exists to provide a safe environment for our community and visitors, and once again, our patrolling members delivered. Our capability is built on the skills and commitment of our members, and this was evident throughout the season.

The annual Skills Maintenance process is no small task, and under the leadership of Jess Menzies and the training team, we successfully completed 329 Bronze proficiency re-certifications, plus all the higher awards. This represents a significant effort and ensures we remain patrol-ready week in and week out.

Training continues to be a key strength of the club, with new members coming through and existing members building on their qualifications. These additions continue to strengthen our patrols and provide depth across all areas of lifesaving capability.



LIFESAVING (CONTINUED)

Looking ahead, maintaining proficiency levels and increasing higher award qualifications — particularly IRB and ART — will remain a priority to ensure all patrols are well supported.

Collectively, we contributed 8952 patrol hours across beach operations and support services, including Jet Ski, Duty Officer, and SurfCom. This reflects the strong commitment within the club, with many members completing 100% of their rostered patrol hours.

- Season statistics include:
- 322 preventative actions
 - 13 rescues (various methods)
 - 19 first aid cases

NSW STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

After winning the pointscore for 11 years in a row we were beaten by Wanda who has been chasing us for the last 11 years. While finishing 2nd, we did win the most gold medals (34), and looking back over the years it's one of our biggest haul of gold.

Across 4 days of racing, the club showcased spectacular individual and team performances across all disciplines.

Notable female achievements included:

- Olivia Clues won 8 gold medals
- Pipi Te Pania won 5 gold medals
- Jemma Smith won 5 gold medals, including the Open Water, Champion Lifesaver, and Patrol Competitions events
- Piper Harrison fresh off having an outstanding Shaw and Partners Iron series won the Open Female Iron for the first time.

Notable male achievements included:

- Jayke Rees and Charlie Verco won 5 gold medals. Charlie's medal haul included the open board race making it back-to-back
- Jackson Borg won 4 gold medals

60% of our points came from team events, with over 50 athletes contributing to the point score, showing the depth and determination of the club.

Newport SLSC achieved 4th place at the Australian Titles after 5 years of finishing 2nd, and this title was the closest points score we have seen for at least 2 decades as Northcliffe normally dominate the event.

Jemma Smith had an outstanding championships winning the Female Athlete of the carnival. Jemma won Open Female Champion Lifesaver for the 13th time and then took out the Open Female Ski Race. On top of that, she was part of the Open Patrol team that finally took out the gold.

Newport SLSC is one of only 4 clubs to consistently finish in the top 10 over the last 13 years, since the Academy began in 2013.

Surrounded by Queensland clubs, we are still holding on to being one of the strongest clubs in Australia. We took a team of only 50 competitors to Aussies and this was our smallest team in the last 8 years. Our team consisted of Youth, Masters, Lifesaving, Rowing, Adaptive, and Open-water competitors. Without a doubt, the entire team showed true sportsmanship, talent, and friendship in supporting each other. A special thank you goes to the support crew and officials who made it possible for the competitors to compete as they can't do it without your support.

Across the team events:

- Our female team won the Open Board Relay in and that was back-to-back champions
- Our female ski teams won the Opens, U19's and U17's.

Notable milestone achievements included:

- Pipi Te Pania winning the U19 Ironperson for the first time
- Piper Harrison finally winning a gold at the Aussies to claim her cap in the Mixed Double Ski with Harrison Taurins, and then kept the gold coming in the Open Female Ski Relay
- Bronte Kippax one of our talented U17 ski paddlers won 2 golds in U17 and U19 Ski Relays to also claim a cap
- The Pegrum Twins (Ella and Ashleigh) won the U17 Board Rescue to claim their caps
- Harrison Taurins won gold in the Mixed Double Ski

- Mitchell Trim came so so close with a silver in the Open Ski
- Both our Male and Female Taplin's picked up silver in very close races.

These championships showed that we might have been down on numbers, but we do deliver on the big stage.

WORLD OCEAN SERIES

The World Ocean Series results this year were outstanding as this event is like a mini Aussies every month and is run all over the country. Competitors need to be very consistent and none more than Jackson Borg who won the Male MVP award after finishing 4th in the iron, 5th in the ski and 10th in the swim.

Other overall finishes:

- Sarah Locke 2nd in the swim
- Charlie Verco 3rd in the board
- Piper Harrison 3rd in the ski
- Jayke Rees 4th in the ski

Again, it shows the depth and the strength of our competitors.

It was one hundred years ago, 1926, when Newport SLSC won its first Aussie medal - third in the open Surfboat. It was rewarding for our Surfboat crews to go one better this season with a second at Aussies.

The u19 female 'Nightmare' started rowing over winter and from their first race in November kept improving. A first at Forster and third at Nth Cronulla before Christmas set them on their way. The crew; Milla Bonasera, Ava Cran, Macy Pickering and Elise Shanahan are all just sixteen, giving a couple of years experience to most of their competition but their never say die attitude saw them second at the Metropolitan championships and an excruciatingly close second at Aussies.

The u23 'Stingers' had an excellent first up win at Freshwater in November, but a lower back injury to Alani Barros took its toll until Christmas. The rest of the crew; Zoe Ellis, April McCarney and Ella Gale kept rowing with subs while Alani recovered.

In November, Louise Purnell, Gem Lehman, and Jan Proudfoot formed a women’s team, while Laurence McCoy, Ashley Brown, and Michael Stanley-Jones from Avalon made up a composite team. Our teams achieved 6th place overall and were awarded a \$100 Harbord Hotel voucher.

The highlight of the carnival was Ashley Brown’s victory in the Men’s Over 50s dash, earning him a \$50 Harbord Hotel voucher.

Mona Vale Masters

The December carnival at Mona Vale saw Adam Willis compete with us for the first time. Adam alongside Ashley Brown, Julia Jones-Hughes, Laurence McCoy, Jan Proudfoot and Craig Manning from Avalon were able to make up a couple of composite teams. The surf was up so we raced in the Basin, and the emphasis was on fun—especially the last event of the day which involved giant blow-up swans.

Adrian Curlewis Twilight Carnival

At Palm Beach in January, three girls and one guy (Louise Purnell, Gem Lehman, Jill Macintyre & Pat Quinlan) competed for Newport. Laurence McCoy raced with the Avalon team: Craig Manning, Dave Spencer and Nick Brook. Ashley Brown and Darren Warrener teamed up with long-time ski training mate Kevin Lee, and Daylan Cameron from Narrabeen. It enjoyable to watch Ash and Darren’s group cross the finish line first a few times. However, the overall winners are decided by a secret handicap formula based on age and gender, so we always head to Palm Beach with the intention of making it a fun training session rather than chasing glory. Branch Championships (Queenscliff)

The Newport Masters came 13th with 8 gold, 5 silver, 7 bronze, 3 fourths, 3 fifths and a sixth place. Australian Championships (Kirra and North Kirra)

The Australian Championships (“Aussies”) took place at North Kirra in late March over two days in particularly challenging conditions. Matt Bell joined the team (as he is now 30 years old), and the masters (lifesaving, beach and water combined) finished 29th in the points score, which is impressive for a team of 8 water competitors, 2 lifesaving (Bec Capell and Guyren Smith) plus Ted Smithies, Newport’s legendary beach sprinter and flags competitor.

- Ashley Brown - Silver in the 50-54 yrs 2km ocean swim, 50-54 yrs Surf Race, and 50-54 yrs Ironman

Rudi took great pride in being an on the beach surf life saver and was very eager to meet his patrol

His dedication to surf life saving has seen Rudi earn a 10-year and 15-year Surf Life Saving Australia ‘National Patrol Service Award’.
