GEORGE PHELPS OAM

George commenced his SLSC service at Queenscliff SLSC in 1954, obtained his Bronze Medallion in 1956 and stayed there until 1963. He then joined Pambula SLSC in 1964 and stayed there until 1966.

Following this he joined Newport SLSC in 1976 as an Active Reserve Member. He and was the club's Chief Instructor in 1979-1980 staying on until 1989. He then re joined in 1997 as a Long Service Member. He was the club's Chief Instructor in 1999-2000 and remained until 2002. Following this he was a Long Service Member from 2004-2005 until his passing in early 2018.

In the late 1970s George was a member of the club's March Past Team which included a number of other younger members' fathers which he enjoyed immensely.

George was awarded his Order of Australia Medal in 2002 for long term very committed voluntary service to many local organisations

including Newport SLSC and SLSC.

In fairly recent times George was joined at the club by his son Peter, a Long Service Member, and grandchildren, Polly and Aja, in the Nippers group. He was very chuffed by their involvement.

In the season of 2016-2017 George was awarded his 40 Year SLSC Service award.

George was also a very important part of the "Pool to Peak" ocean swims event. He provided assistance over a number of years with the security of competing swimmers belongings in the club's IRB storage area whilst the swims took place.

He was always a cheerful, happy person willing to assist wherever possible around the club and will be sadly missed.





PRESIDENT

It is my pleasure to present the 2017/18 Annual Report of the Newport Surf Lifesaving Club, our one hundred and ninth year of patrolling Newport Beach.

A season that again has ensured through our well attended and effective patrols we have achieved our primary objective of “No lives lost at Newport Beach during a Newport patrol”.

It has been another fantastic season for our Club probably the best season ever and as a Club we have excelled across all aspects of Surf Lifesaving.

Some of our season highlights include:

Under the guidance of our new Club Captain Jess Menzies, our patrolling strength and exceptional standard of patrols remains to ensure that Newport Beach is a safe environment for our local community and all beach visitors. To all the Newport patrolling members thank you for your vigilance and service, your efforts have been outstanding, and your community dedication is greatly appreciated.

Our instructors have done another magnificent job again this season under the guidance of our Chief Instructor, Guyren Smith. This season 51 people successfully completed their Bronze Medallions, which is a fantastic effort. Further to this, 43 young members completed their Surf Rescue Certificate and have joined our patrols. Congratulations to all our trainers.

As a Club we had another busy year running events and we successfully hosted the Newport Surf Boat Carnival, Newport Water Carnival, The Newport SLSC Social Golf Day, The Sports Lunch, the Barefoot Ball fundraiser for the Club and Cystic Fibrosis Community Care and the Pool2Peak Ocean Swim that again was an enormous success with a record number of swimmers participating.

Significant congratulations this season must go to Matt Halakas and his Junior Activities Committee, age managers and volunteers. Our Nippers programme continues to be a remarkable success with almost 400 children this season

joining Newport, having fun and most importantly learning about surf safety and surf life saving each Sunday.

Earlier this year we partnered with the Pittwater Friends of Soibada and introduced a scholarship programme for two of our young Bronze Medallion Trainers & Assessors to travel to East Timor with the Pittwater Friends of Soibada to provide first aid training. Newport trainers Jess Menzies and Lauren Budd went to East Timor earlier in the year for a great and challenging life experience undertaking a few First Aid clinics for the benefit of the local community of Soibada.

The current pressing need for improvements to the Club House facilities and desperate need to increase storage space was significantly advanced this season, with our Local Member Rob Stokes providing \$100,000 of State Government funding to undertake the required Development Application and associated planning studies for the implementation of the Club's Masterplan vision of which we are most grateful.

Further following initial positive discussions with Michael Regan, the Mayor of the Northern Beaches Council, the Council has now appointed an Architect to progress the Club's Masterplan to the required Development Application and this work is currently positively progressing.

As a Club we are indebted to Rob Stokes and Michael Regan for the valuable and significant assistance they have both provided us this year in progressing the Club's vision for the Clubhouse facilities, again thank you Rob and Michael.

As a club we achieved immense success again in competition and some of the highlights included:

- For the first time in our history some of our Newport Nippers travelled to the Australian Pool Lifesaving Championship held this year in South Australia. Our small team came 7th overall and broke two Australian records in the process.
- Again, as a first in our Club's long history Newport was crowned the winner of the Overall Branch Championship Point Score that includes a combination of Nippers', Open's and Master's branch results.
- Newport 1st in the Open Point Score at the NSW Championships for the 5th consecutive year

- Newport Nippers 2nd at the NSW Age Championships, the best result for our junior team in the history of the Club and an awesome achievement
- Newport 2nd in the Open Point Score at the Australian Championships
- Newport Winner of the Handicap Point Score at the Australian Championships
- Additionally, at the Sydney Northern Beaches' Branch Awards presentation evening, Newport SLSC won several awards including:
 - » Most Outstanding Club: 5th place
 - » Kieran Menzies: Support Services Award
 - » Adrian Hill: Raymond Matthew Brown Radio Operator's Award

HONORARY TREASURER

This being my first year as the Honorary Treasurer of our club, I enjoyed the steep learning curve. I must thank Tom Kellaway for the documented audit trail of previous years which assisted our financial procedures to be controlled and maintained in a professional manner.

I would like to acknowledge the significant assistance provided to me by Bev Barnes. Bev maintains our back of house in wonderful shape from the day-to-day administration of accounts to hall hire and organising bar activities. Her diligent efforts fly under the radar of most and we are fortunate to have someone of her ability working for the club.

I would also like to thank Michael Coates for his accounting expertise and assistance in the preparation of these accounts.

2018 has been another eventful year for the club financially. The club has managed its funds in a responsible manner and endeavoured to maintain a focus on core revenue streams. We had

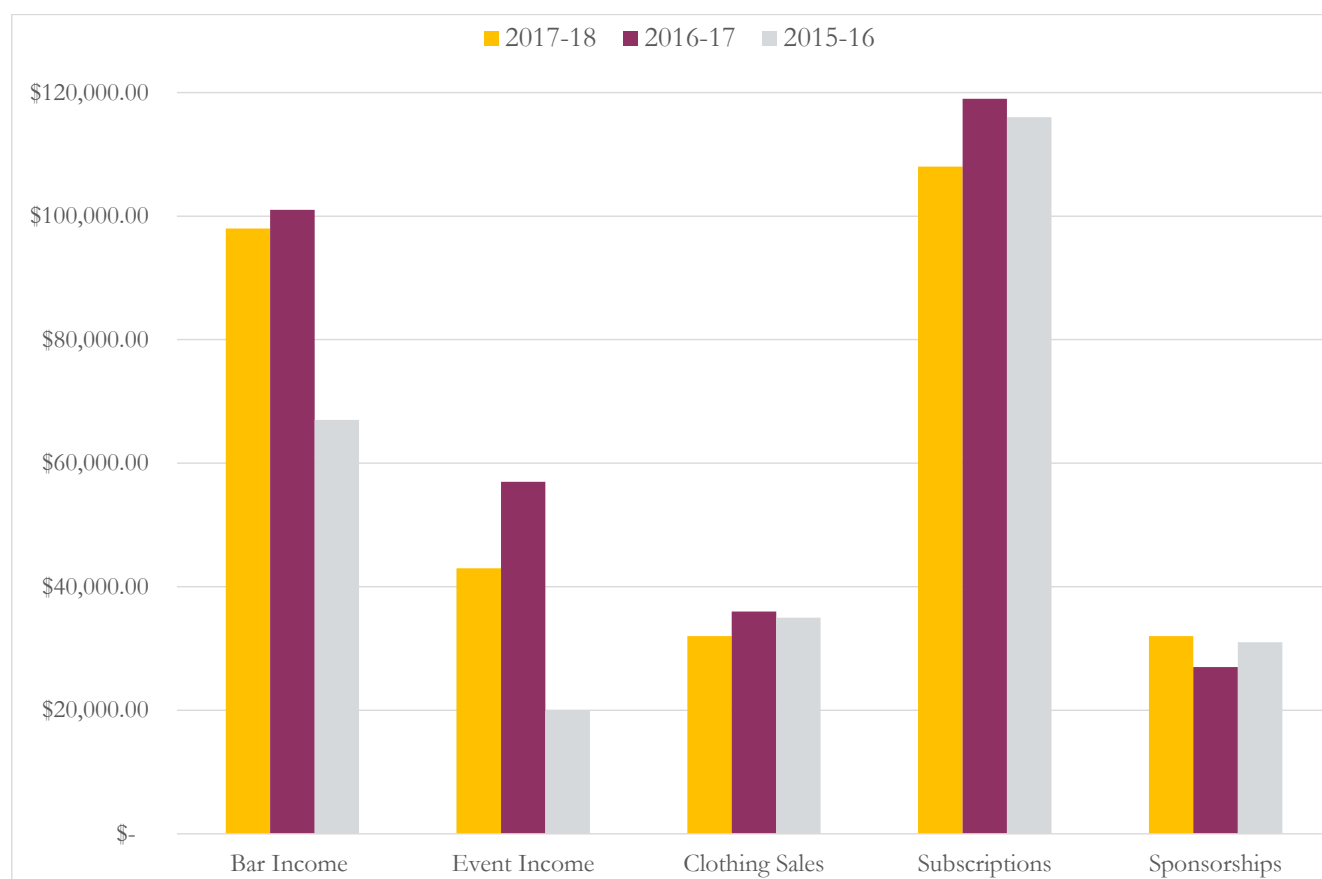
a significant decrease in our donations, functions and subscriptions that accounted for our overall decrease in revenue. Importantly, the club took the decision to increase bar pricing in May 2018, which will assist revenue streams for the future and place less burden on the contributions of members. We will focus on subscriptions and event income going forward.

2018 saw some key financial metrics:

- » Revenue: 4.6% decrease on 2017
- » Gross Surplus: 4.4% decrease on 2017
- » Ongoing Expenditure: 1.0% increase on 2017

The table below is a snapshot of revenue as a comparison to other years. It highlights the decision of the management committee to continue to pass on most of our revenues to the ongoing operation of the club including the funding of a new initiative, Soibada, Timor-Leste tour, and a range of repair activities.

The bar takings remained steady whilst we amortised the Presentation Evening income to season 2019. We reviewed our bar procedure



during the year and it was agreed to increase our point of sale price in May 2018 to help overcome an increasing cost base.

The successful operation of the bar is thanks to a committed group of individuals who work tirelessly to make our club facilities perform. To Bev Barnes, Adrian Hill, Hunter Beard, John Greenhill, Dave Garnham, and all our trained staff, I would like to extend our sincere thanks for your support and hard work.

The annual Golf Day was resurrected and made a modest profit thanks to Matt Thomas, Will Brown, Matt Butler and Adam Walsh.

The Pool to Peak swim is the club's largest fund raiser for the year and again showed a healthy profit of over \$20K. We thank John Guthrie and his amazing committee for their excellent work and all club participants for their support on the day.

We again supported the Pub to Pub Charity Fun Run with the race finishing at our club raising some well-earned funding from the Rotary Club. Thanks again to Ian Crutch for organising our army of support on the day.

The clothing shop continues to perform for the club, generating a modest return, but also providing a comprehensive range of products to our membership base. We thank both Snezana Bartlem and Rebecca Capell for their ongoing work and commitment in this space.

The Nipper programme continues to assist the club with maintaining a healthy membership base and is a great means of attracting new members to the club. The programme had over 400 registered Nippers for the season and thanks go to Matt Halakas and his awesome team for making this area of our club a fun place to be and resurrecting the Basin SRC training camp.

The club's overall expenditure was on par with last year with most funds being directed to improvements to member facilities and equipment. Some key equipment purchases included a new IRB, rescue boards and chairs for the hall. Some of our maintenance items included the replacement of the ventilation system to members gym and bathroom, painting of the hall, resurfacing of the timber floor, creating ergonomic storage for the IRB shed, as well as general maintenance. We thank all those members who contributed their time - Bev Barnes, John Sherman, Craig McDougal, Brendan Doyle, Barry Cooper, Glen Borg, Adrian Hill and John Greenhill. Again, the club owes you a huge thank you for your work and efforts.

The club remains in a solid financial position going into the 2019 season and has the capacity to continue delivering a quality service to the community while maintaining our equipment and member facilities in excellent condition.

Notes to the Financial Statements

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 2009 (NSW), the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 (NSW) and the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012 (Cth) and the club's constitution. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the above acts and regulations, the club's constitution and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

- AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements
- AASB 107 Statements of Cash Flows
- AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors
- AASB 1031 Materiality
- AASB 1048 Interpretation of Accounting Standards
- AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures

No other Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the Association is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

In the event the carrying value of plant and equipment is greater than the estimated recoverable amount, the carrying value is written down immediately to the estimated recoverable amount. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the association and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to the statement of comprehensive income during the financial period in which they are incurred.

Depreciation

The depreciation method and useful life used for items of property, plant and equipment (excluding freehold land) reflects the pattern in which their future economic benefits are expected to be consumed by the association. Depreciation commences from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements. The depreciation method and useful life of assets is reviewed annually to ensure they are still appropriate.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation surplus relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value. Bank overdrafts are presented within current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

Financial Instruments

Recognition, initial measurement and derecognition

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the Association becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument, and are measured initially at fair value adjusted by transactions costs, except for those carried at fair value through profit or loss, which are measured initially at fair value. Subsequent measurement of financial assets and financial liabilities are described below. Financial assets are derecognised when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the financial asset expire, or when the financial asset and all substantial risks and rewards are transferred. A financial liability is derecognised when it is extinguished, discharged, cancelled or expires.

Classification and subsequent measurement of financial assets

For the purpose of subsequent measurement, financial assets other than those designated and effective as hedging instruments are classified into the following categories upon initial recognition:

- loans and receivables
- financial assets at Fair Value Through Profit or Loss (FVTPL)
- Held-To-Maturity (HTM) investments
- Available-For-Sale (AFS) financial assets

All financial assets except for those at FVTPL are subject to review for impairment at least at each reporting date to identify whether there is any objective evidence that a financial asset or a group of financial assets is impaired. Different criteria to determine impairment are applied for each category of financial assets, which are described below.

All income and expenses relating to financial assets that are recognised in profit or loss are presented within finance costs or finance income, except for impairment of trade receivables which is presented within other expenses.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market. After initial recognition, these are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment. Discounting is omitted where the effect of discounting is immaterial. The Group's trade and most other receivables fall into this category of financial instruments.

Individually significant receivables are considered for impairment when they are past due or when other objective evidence is received that a specific counterparty will default. Receivables that are not considered to be individually impaired are reviewed for impairment in groups, which are determined by reference to the industry and region of a counterparty and other shared credit risk characteristics. The impairment loss estimate is then based on recent historical counterparty default rates for each identified group.

Financial assets at FVTPL

Financial assets at FVTPL include financial assets that are either classified as held for trading or that meet certain conditions and are designated at FVTPL upon initial recognition. Assets in this category are measured at fair value with gains or losses recognised in profit or loss. The fair values of financial assets in this category are determined by reference to active market transactions or using a valuation technique where no active market exists.

HTM investments

HTM investments are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments and fixed maturity other than loans and receivables. Investments are classified as HTM if the Association has the intention and ability to hold them until maturity. The Association currently holds long term deposits designated into this category. HTM investments are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

If there is objective evidence that the investment is impaired, determined by reference to external credit ratings, the financial asset is measured at the present value of estimated future cash flows. Any changes to the carrying amount of the investment, including impairment losses, are recognised in profit or loss.

AFS financial assets

AFS financial assets are non-derivative financial assets that are either designated to this category or do not qualify for inclusion in any of the other categories of financial assets. The Association's AFS financial assets include listed securities. All AFS financial assets are measured at fair value. Gains and losses are recognised in other comprehensive income and reported within the AFS reserve within equity, except for impairment losses and foreign exchange differences on monetary assets, which are recognised in profit or loss. When the asset is disposed of or is determined to be impaired the cumulative gain or loss recognised in other comprehensive income is reclassified from the equity reserve to profit or loss and presented as a reclassification adjustment within other comprehensive income. Interest calculated using the effective interest method and dividends are recognised in profit or loss within 'revenue'.

Reversals of impairment losses for AFS debt securities are recognised in profit or loss if the reversal can be objectively related to an event occurring after the impairment loss was recognised. For AFS equity investments impairment reversals are not recognised in profit loss and any subsequent increase in fair value is recognised in other comprehensive income.

Classification and subsequent measurement of financial liabilities

The Association's financial liabilities include borrowings and trade and other payable.

Financial liabilities are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, except for financial liabilities held for trading or designated at FVTPL, that are carried subsequently at fair value with gains or losses recognised in profit or loss.

All interest-related charges and, if applicable, changes in an instrument's fair value that are reported in profit or loss are included within finance costs or finance income.

Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. No value is ascribed to goods for resale that have been donated to the Association where fair value cannot be reliably determined. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less any applicable selling expenses.

Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Responsibility of the Committee's for the Financial Report



This year returned to having our own members training the ARTC course, this is a strong step that will see

The year also saw the first of our young trainers head to East Timor with the Pittwater Friends of Soibada to spend a week providing resuscitation training to the medical staff and school students in the remote village of Soibada. COMPETITION ORGANISER

Seaason 2017/18 could best be described as one where the Newport competition squad showed the depth and breadth of the team with all age groups achieving great results across a broader range of events. We retained our number one ranking at Ocean 6, Branch and State Championships. We bounced back at Aussies to take out second place with a record score, winning the Handicap Point Score as well as the Under 19s Fist Aid Competition “Ian Mackie AM Trophy”.

Last November Jake Lynch won National Athlete of the Year, after becoming the first Australian to win the sprint/beach flag double at the World Life Saving Championships in Holland last year.

The season started with Maddie Spencer competing in the 21st ‘Molokai-To-O’ahu Paddleboard World Championships (M2O). Maddie took home victory in her first M2O for the

women’s Prone Stock Division, coming in almost 1 hour ahead of second place.

At the International Surf Rescue Challenge held in New Zealand Jake and Blake did us proud helping Australia to victory. Hannah Minogue captained the Aussie team to a win in Japan at the Sanyo Bussan Cup.

Once again our proportional representations in Branch and State teams is the envy of other clubs. The Sydney Northern Beaches InterBranch team included Jake Morris, Mitch Morris, Joel Piper, Jodie Louw, Oscar Smith, Alex Lefevre, Zach Morris, Taylor Gabb, James Finn, Madison Louw, Jami Prowse, Reuben Sharma, Bailee Radford, Isaac Smith, Max Brooks (Captain), Lara Moses, Blake Drysdale and Laura Shorter (Captain).

The NSW State Team included Max Brooks, Mitchell Trim, Blake Drysdale, Jake Lynch, Laura Shorter, Grace Gurrand Isaac Smith. The Reserve Men’s crew ‘Sea Cucumbers’ comprising Tom Holland, Tom Howes, Tim Gunns, Scott Quin and Rob Emerson also represented NSW at Interstate. Once again these athlete’s results helped NSW to come away the winner.

At Ocean6 (previously Summer of Surf) we had some incredible results. Our beach team dominated the sand as Jake and Blake were strong in both sprint and flags; Jake 1st and Blake 2nd in both respectively. Our water team came together like never before. Georgia and Max had great KNG performances finishing 3rd and 4th overall, Ollie won the swim, and as a team we again won the Overall Club Championship.

At the Coolangatta Gold long course we had some outstanding performances with Georgia and Jackson just missing a podium finish coming 4th, with Max close behind in 6th. Maddie and Phoebe had great races to finish 11th and 12th. We had great results in the short course as well. Isaac taking out the U19 Mens and Matt Bell on the podium with a 3rd in the Open Mens. Grace and Olivia also had great races to finish 6th and 9th in the U19 Female. Nick Carroll carried the Masters’ torch in the short course, coming in 4th in the 50+ category.

Our championship season was stacked with individual and team highlights. This season at

State and Aussies we collected 410 medals from 100 of our competitors, 80% of them team medals.

Our Open female Board Relay team of Miller, Moses and Spencer again showed what a force they are as a board relay combination to win the gold medal at Aussies for the second time in three years. They also won this event at State and Branch, and also topped the Board Relay points score at Ocean6.

We had some other notable wins with the Open Female Ski Relay team also claiming gold at Aussies. The Open men claimed our first ever Surf Team Medal at Aussies with an incredible team effort against a red hot field. They also had a great board relay effort to claim bronze and were unlucky in the Scarborough disaster zone, fighting back in the Taplin to claim bronze.

Our First Aid dynamic duo of Linda & Lily swept Branch, State and Aussies claiming gold an age group up in the U19s.

We had some outstanding individual performances. Zach Morris won 17 medals across State and Aussies with 9 of them gold. Georgia claimed her 5th Iron gold at State and finished

the season with 14 medals, 10 of them gold and 3 Open gold at Aussies.

We also saw great depth in our U17 females crew with incredible performances from Emily Doyle, Madison Louw and Jami Prowse claiming 37 medals between them with 11 gold.

Isaac Smith also had a great haul of 12 medals, with 3 gold, including an impressive Iron win at State that left the competition wondering if they were in the next race.

On the sand Jake and Blake had mixed results at State and Aussies, after having dominated the Ocean 6 series. Blake still came out on top to claim gold at Aussies in the Flags with Jake taking out the bronze. Jake did however keep some bragging rights having won the flags at State. Both Jake and Laura narrowly missed gold at State in the sprint but held their heads high to bring home the silver.

At State Laura Shorter also won silver in the Relay along with Macy Carrothers, Bailee Radford and Bethany Pate. Macy Carrothers gained a bronze in the U17s Flags and the boys won bronze in both the U19s and U17s relays with

For the second year running we showed our rowing dominance in the U23 women's division. The Whiprays, (Tara Doyle, Abby Ballesty, Meagan Barr, Zoe King and Michael King) took out the Branch champs, silver at the Australian Surf Rowing Open, bronze at State, and a very hard-earned silver at the Aussies topping off a very impressive season.

In IRB racing we were State medallists with a bronze in the U23 Rescue. This team is gaining momentum and just getting better year by year.

Our Champion Lifesaver, First Aid and Patrol Competition squad also had some great results with their super star coaches leading the way as Phoebe and Guyren took out gold at State in the Champion Lifesaver. Phoebe followed it up with silver at Aussies and Guyren brought home bronze. Marvin and Chloe teamed up in the U19 First Aid teams to take silver at State and Jan Proudfoot also won silver in the Champion Life Saver at State. Our

Patrol Competition team also had a great season with the U17s bringing home bronze Aussies and the Opens winning bronze at State.

We the undersigned as financial members of Newport Surf Life Saving Club wish to nominate John Guthrie for Life Membership. We have examined the Club records for him and believe that he has the service to qualify for this prestigious award.

Attached is a detailed record of John's Club service commencing in the 1951-1952 season when nearly a 15-year-old he obtained his Qualifying Certificate the then version of the present Surf Rescue Certificate albeit with a far stronger focus on the Rescue and Resuscitation event drills. This was followed up by him obtaining his Bronze Medallion early in 1955.

In addition to this we advise as follows:

John has been a member more than 50 years after having several short stints away due to family and work commitments since he first joined. He has served on the Club Management Committee for 13 years in positions including Assistant Gear Steward, Club Treasurer, Deputy President then President for 3 years and in recent times a very valuable role as Club Publicity Officer for 7 consecutive years.

He has also been involved as a Patrol member, Beach Competitor, member of the Bartender Power Boat Crew, March Past Team member and since 2012-2013 Chairman of the Club's very successful Ocean Swims Committee.

In addition to the Club's Oceans Swims Committee John has been for several years a member of the Peninsular Swims Committee (Whale Beach, Avalon, Newport and Mona Vale SLSCs) who assist each other with Safety Craft and personnel as well as obtaining funds (\$5,000 p.a.) from our local Council to assist in promoting the group's swims each year.

Our Ocean swims have been most successful in raising much needed revenue for the club and in the last 3 years nearly \$60,000 has been contributed. This day also brings all sections of the club together to make it a most worthwhile event. John as our Sub Committee Chairman is extremely enthusiastic and a wonderful leader in all aspects of the event including planning well ahead for each swim. He spends many hours drumming up publicity and support wherever possible locally as

well as in other publications such as "Destination NSW" a State site where our swim has featured both in English as well as the Japanese language. John also instigated a very comprehensive Procedures Manual with all the lead up steps and contacts that go into the Swims so that future Committees have a very good head start on the event. He is a regular competitor in our Swim as well as other local ocean events to garner ideas on improving our organisation and event to encourage more swimmers to participate.

In recognition of John's sterling efforts in serving our club members with regular Newsletters both in Paper as well as Electronic form for many years as well as outside organizations such as Pittwater Online News, Peninsular Living, The Manly Daily and Surf Life Saving Sydney Northern Beaches Branch Newsletters etc, he was presented with the annual Surf Life Saving Sydney Northern Beaches Branch "Outstanding Media Service" award in both the 2013-2014 and 2015-2016 seasons. Over the past

5 + years there have been well over 200 editions of his News Reports including 179 in weekly Email version during the surf season distributed to our members keeping them up to date with club news.

As our oldest living, actively serving member, soon to celebrate his 80th birthday, we believe it would be very fitting for this Award to be bestowed on John for his lifetime of dedicated service to Newport SLSC.

We request that this proposal be processed through the required procedures with the object of the vote on John Guthrie's Life Membership to be put to the 2016-2017 Annual General Meeting for approval.
