Newport's Surfboat crews have had a big couple of weeks. Our u23 women, the 'Stingers' won all their eight races at the Australian team trials at Ocean Beach. The crew; Ella Gale, Alani Barros, April McCarney, Zoe Ellis and sweep Michael King will compete in the Trans Tasman Cup at Waihi Beach in New Zealand in February.

They backed that up a day later by winning gold at the Australian Shortcourse Championships, a 500 metre sprint instead of the usual 800 m. Our Reserve women, the 'Swordfish'; Jenna Powell, Kate Wilson, Chloe Butler and Claire Ford finished just out of the medals in their final.

Last weekend at Nth Cronulla the 'Stingers' continued their form, winning all their races at the first of the NSW team selection events. A great start to the season.

Before you enter the water

LOOK

- For the red and yellow flags, if they're on the beach swim between them
- For signs and warnings about the area
- At the conditions and weather forecast
- For rip currents and other dangers

STAY

- Assess the conditions based on your own ability
- If it's unsafe, don't swim
- Don't go alone
- Complete the online Beach Passport for basic training and education on water safety
